Position Overview:

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

The teacher will establish a faith-filled environment, demonstrate knowledge of content, facilitate learning for all students following the prescribed curriculum, model Gospel values, be a contributing member of a professional learning community, and participate in all required duties as assigned. Primary responsibilities shall include student safety, effective collaboration, and attention to each student's readiness to learn including needed guidance, discipline, and social/emotional well-being.

- Actively participate in faculty or department meetings, assist in building efforts to plan, budget, implement, and evaluate the school's program
- Serves as a positive role model for students and practices the behaviors that are expected of students
- Perform adjunct duties as assigned by the principal
