





Part-Time Music Teacher 2023 - 2024

Position Overview:

The Music Teacher will establish a faith-filled environment, demonstrate knowledge of content, facilitate learning for all students following the prescribed curriculum, model Gospel values, be a contributing member of a professional learning community, and participate in all required duties as assigned. Primary Responsibilities shall include student safety, effective collaboration, and attention to each student's readiness to learn including needed guidance, discipline, and social/emotional well-being.

- Plan, implement, and supervise the music education program TK 8th grades in accordance with the goals, policies, procedures, philosophy, and curriculum of the school
- Organize Christmas Production and Spring Concert in cooperation with other faculty
- Prepare teaching outlines for courses of study following all required content standards
- Conduct ongoing evaluations of student achievement through formal and informal assessments
- Maintain discipline in the classroom and other areas through positive but clear discipline practices
- Provide necessary and effective parent communication, including Parent/Student conferences, teacher Google Classroom sites, and gradebooks
- Provide a neat, orderly, and welcoming classroom environment including a display of classroom guidelines, and bulletin boards
- Provide lunch/playground/carline supervision as assigned
- To maintain daily lesson plans, objectives, and learning opportunities that will help each child grow toward his / her total potential physically, mentally, emotionally and spiritually.
- To meet weekly with Choir/ Cantors and prepare cantors and readers for mass.
- To actively participate in staff meetings, making them an important and viable part of the program.

Other Responsibilities:

- Responsible for attending school-sponsored events held after normal school hours as specified in the Faculty and Staff Handbook (i.e. Christmas Concert and other special events)
- Responsible for attending professional development opportunities sponsored by the school and the Diocese of Orange as scheduled throughout the school year.
- Responsible for attending the Diocese of Orange New Teacher Orientation, if applicable
- Adhere to the policies and procedures of the Diocesan Handbook and the St. Pius V Catholic School Faculty and Staff Handbook
- Other duties as assigned by the assistant principal, and/or principal

Desired Qualifications:

- Practicing Catholic with general knowledge and understanding of the institution of the Catholic Church
- Diocesan religious certification or willingness to obtain certification
- Experience integrating educational technology seamlessly into daily instruction to support instruction and learning
- Strong knowledge of relevant curriculum, data-driven instruction, curriculum mapping,
- Strong knowledge of strategies of engaging students with diverse learning needs
- Excellent classroom management skills
- Strong interpersonal, collaborative, organizational, and administrative skills
- Complies with guidelines established for CPR and first aid training

- Bachelor's degree with preliminary/clear multiple subject credential or single subject credential relevant to the position
- Master's degree desired
- Previous teaching experience is preferred, but not required
