Job Description: Physical Education Teacher & Athletic Director

Responsibilities:

- Act as a role model of professionalism in a Catholic environment.
- Supports the philosophy, policies, and goals of the school, as well as the decisions made by the Administrators and Advisory Board.
- Insures the health, safety, and welfare of all students.
- Holds in strict confidence all matters pertaining to the school.
- Adheres to all policies and procedures as outlined in the Parent/Student Handbook and the RCBO Employee Handbook.
- Attend faculty and administrative meetings.
- Maintains all required certifications per employment contract.
- Attend all Diocesan training and professional development opportunities, including the Diocese of Orange new teacher orientation and the CSJ workshop, along with attaining and maintaining religious certification.

Definition:

The Physical Education Teacher & Athletic Director teaches students in Transitional Kindergarten through Eighth grade P.E. class weekly as well as oversees all aspects of the afterschool sports program.

Duties:

1. Develop curriculum and weekly lesson plans for TK-8th grade, submitting to Administration prior to implementing Monday morning.
2. Maintain gradebook keeping current biweekly.
3. Establish consistent class management approach promoting self-direction, positive self-image. Set high standards for student behavior, managing inappropriate behaviors effectively and age-appropriately.
4. Plan, coordinate and oversee special events such as Olympic Day and Jog-a-Thon.
5. Communicate with Administration, Faculty, students and parents, following Diocesan Employee Handbook guidelines with emails and any interactions.
6. Design, maintain and regularly update Google Classroom.



7. Overseeing all aspects of the Athletics Programs and department.
8. Establishes and maintains records for all afterschool sports activities.
9. Coordinating all aspects of the Fall, Winter and Springs sports seasons, including but not limited to, finding and coordinating coaches, scheduling events, player rosters, equipment management, setting up for athletic events, purchasing snack cart items and more.

Education/Experience:

- A bachelor's or master's degree preferably in Physical Education, or related field
- Experience teaching elementary students grade TK–8
- Experience coaching

License/ Certificate Requirement:

- A valid California Teacher's Credential
- A valid Certification of Basic First Aid and CPR
